Coronavirus (COVID-19) restrictions Victoria

STOP PRESS!!! The following has NOT been updated to represent the new regional COVID regulations!

- We will announce any updates to the COVID safety restrictions in place at the commencement of the meeting.
- Please use the sanitiser provided at the reception area.
- You must currently wear a mask whenever you leave your house unless you have a lawful reason/medical exemption from doing so. Please ensure you wear one to the meeting.
- You can remove the mask when eating or drinking.
- If you are displaying any of the COVID symptoms or are not feeling well please do not attend the meeting.
- Please report to the reception table on arrival and wait until your name is ticked. The list at reception has your name and contact phone number already listed.
- You will then be directed to a separate area where you will be asked to access the Vic Government QR code via your mobile phone or other electronic device. This action is a compulsory requirement as from 28/5/2021 as we hold our meetings in a designated Community facility.

Instructions for access and use of QR code at General Meetings.

As from the 28/5/2021 it is compulsory for us to register our attendance at our meetings under the Vic Government QR code system as they are held in a designated Community facility. This requirement is expected to continue until the Health Authorities recommend otherwise.

While the process may seem daunting to people who are not familiar with the use of the technology, it is really not complicated. It is the same technology now used at all business premises such as Supermarkets, Chemists, Medical Centres, Restaurants, Cafes etc.

If you have not yet downloaded the relevant Service Victoria app to your phone you can get access via either the App Store for Apple products or Google Play for Android products. It is recommended that you download the app before the day of the meeting. Remember this is the same app that is used by Supermarkets etc, so if you have been shopping recently and have had to use your phone to register your entry, then you will already have the app.

When attending the meeting you will be directed to an area that will have several copies of the code applicable to our Club/registered location.

First you must open your phone camera and scan the code. Do not take a picture of the code as that is not how it works.

A screen will appear asking you to type in your name and phone number. (If you have already used your phone in this way the details will likely automatically appear on the screen). Press the item "Check-in to this location".

A new item will appear. Just tap the word "Done". There is no further action required.

If for some technical or outdated phone capability reason you are unable to access the app there are alternate methods that can be used. For one you visit go.vic.gov.au/check-in open the app and enter the code **86JH3X**. That code is unique to our Club and location.

Additionally, for those who do not have a smart phone we can assist with both manual and automated methods, so please do not be concerned. There will be people available to help on the day.


